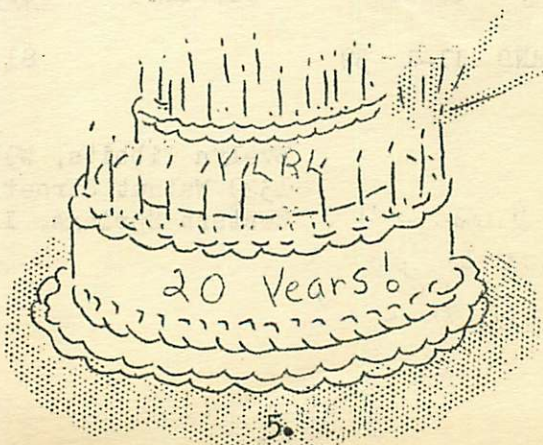
OUR TWENTIETH ANNIVERSARY

HAWAII

Since Hawaii officially became a State Aug. 21, 1959, WASYL will require 50 confirmations for the certificate, as of that date. ARRL rules for DX require foreign land between contact points. Since this condition does not exist for Hawaii, it cannot qualify for DXYL.

EASTERN MEMBERSHIP CHAIRMAN'S REPORT

"From the east section, there were 442 application blanks and cards mailed out to various ones requesting them--of those there were 100 sent direct to the HAWKS of Indiana who took care of their state. I mailed out 150. In this section, there have been 122 new members joined, as of 11-16-59. Fran Foley again handled the state of Florida with 100. This is not a very good percentage of new members for the amount of postage and expense involved. 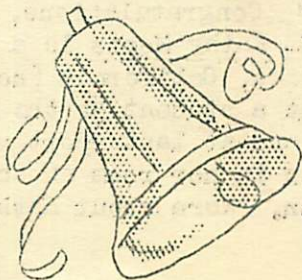

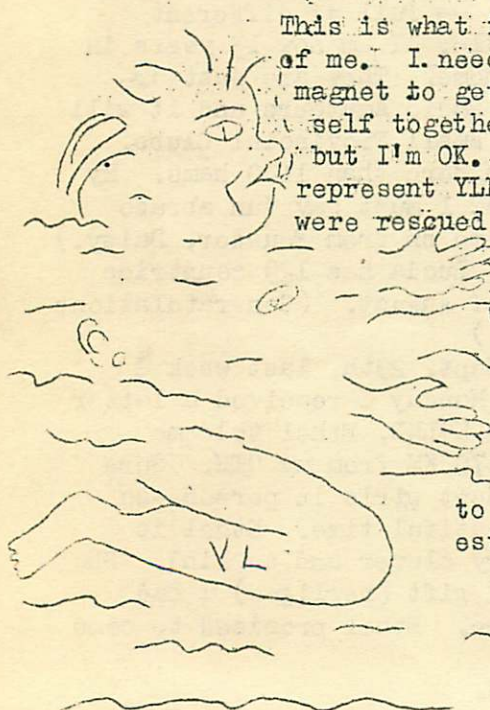

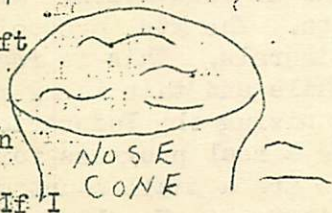

January/February issue told of the loss of the Corcoran Cup when lightning struck the home of the holder, W5HWK. She hoped to replace it as soon as wartime conditions would permit.

OMs call "CQ-YL". YLs call "CQ-OM".

EXCHANGE:

QSO number, RS or RST report, name of state, U.S. Possession, VE district or country.

SCORING:

- (a.) Phone and CW contests will be scored as separate contests.
- (b.) One point is earned for each station worked, YL to OM or OM to YL. A station may be contacted no more than once in each contest for credit.
- (c.) Multiply the number of QSOs by the number of different states, U.S. Possessions, VE districts and countries worked. (Maryland and the District of Columbia count as one state.)
- (d.) Contestants running 150 watts input or less at all times may multiply the result of item "c" by 1.25 (low power multiplier)

Copies of all phone and C.W. logs, showing claimed score, must be postmarked not later than March 31, 1960, and received not later than April 15, 1960, or they will be disqualified. 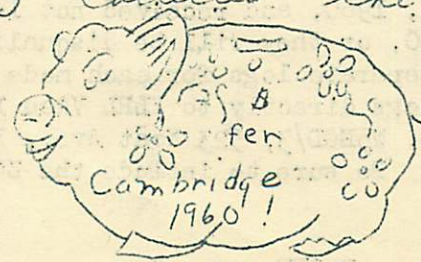
