Our emblem was designed by our Founder early in YLRL history. Ethel -K4LMB - says she chose the deep blue and silver "because she liked them."

Clara - W2RUF - signed "33" even before YLRL days, and it was adopted by YLRL in 1940. It means "Love sealed with friendship between one YL and another YL." 33

QRV

Nita - W8TAY - was the one who suggested QRV-IAM READY as YLRL slogan in 1940.

In 1954, YLRL held a contest to choose a cover design for YL HARMONICS. Viola - W2JZX - was the winner with her 'YL Sitting On Top Of The World' and it has been used ever since that time.
