COCO PALMS RESORT

The Coco Palms Resort is located on ground that was sacred to the ancient Hawaiians. Legend has it that people from Tahiti first landed in Wailua Bay across from the resort. In the large coconut grove the kings and royalty held court and lived. Throughout the resort and Wailua area are remnants of Hawaiian ruins: heiaus (temples), city of refuge, and fish ponds build by the menehunes (elves) as legend tells us.

The road leading from the Coco Palms toward the highlands follows along what once was a sacred highway of the kings. The kings were carried up this road so that their feet would not have to touch ground. Such sacred areas were kapu (off limits) to commoners. The Wailua River was also kapu to commoners. The only commoner who might be taken along the river or highway was an expectant mother.

The beach front area of the resort and the river were considered "jousting" areas. It was forbidden ground to all but kings and their alii warriors. Warriors from other islands would beach their canoes, then line up and hurl challenges to the Kauai warriors who would line up where the highway now runs and hurl back defiance.

Out of respect for the old and sacred customs, the nightly torch lighting ceremony is a recreation of the ceremonies and traditions of more than 100 years ago. Hawaiian boys wearing red malos (loin cloths) sound the call on a conch shell facing first in the direction of the rising sun, then to the setting sun, to the mountains, and to the sea. The drums then beat calling all to the feast that has been prepared. The lighting of the torches follows.

There are numerous stories about Deborah Kapule, a queen of Kauai, who died August 26, 1853 after a long life. The fish ponds at the Coco Palms were built by her. Her large grass houses in the area afforded accommodations for missionaries and travelers who also

enjoyed her excellent food. On her death "The Friend", a newspaper of the time, wrote, "...her loss is deeply felt by her people, among whom her influence for good was very great.

The museum at the Coco Palms Resort contains items from the period and further information on the history of this area. ALOHA


