

APRIL MYSTERY STATION PARTY.  
TO BE CONDUCTED SEPARATELY  
FOR CW AND FONE MEMBERS.

Well, here 'tis gals! That long-promised party in which the fone members of our worthy organization would be shown preference and given a more sporting chance to compete with the many CW ops for prizes! The special feature of this party will be the "MYSTERY STATIONS"-- who will be known only to themselves and the Vice-Pres. and who will operate individually on a certain band. Contacts with these stations will mean twice as many points for you-- so oil up the key and unwind that mike cord (which ever you prefer) and try your luck in contacting the "MYSTERY Stations" on your band.

Dates. 1. For CW Operators: Two week-ends-- May 2, 3, 4, and 9, 10, 11  
2. For Fone ops. two week-ends May 16, 17, 18, and 23, 24, 25

Time. Contest hours will begin each week-end at 7PM Fri. eve, and end at 7PM Sunday evening of each week-end, local time.

Exchange. RST or SA report: name of state you're located in; a d a number, to be composed of the band you are working on plus your power input, your exchange number in contest would be for instance, for 20 fone with 275 watts, 20275.

Scoring. 1. Ten points for each different YLRL station worked, multiplied by the number of states and possessions worked.  
2. Five additional points may be counted by phone participants for each YLRL station they re-contact, provided the contact is not made within 12 hours of the previous contact with that station.

One point may be counted by CW participants for each YLRL station they re-contact, with the same restriction.

3. Twenty points will be given for each contact made with the mystery station on your band. (This bonus will be added on your score by the checking station, after you turn in your tabulated score-sheet).

Regulation Each participant must choose only one band and one division (fone or CW) to work on, and must limit herself to that category in this contest. This means that phone stations may only contact phone stations, and CW stations must contact CW stations-- and only on the same band on which she has chosen to work during the contest! NO CROSS BAND.

Each member must use her own station only, not the OM's. Members not having their own station license can use the station they ordinarily operate.

SCORE sheets must be tabulated as directed, and sent to the checking station for your band, which is designated below:

- 160 meter phone-WSTPE, Marie Corcoran, Wyoming, Ohio, RR 5 Box 40.
- 20 meter phone W2IKY 186-18 Williamson Ave., Springfield, I.I.N.Y.
- 10 meter phone WIMCV A Lucia Littlefield, Box 201, Scarsport, Me.
- 80 Meter CW W8SPJ Gladys Nichols, 203 Wood St., Wapakoneta, Ohio.
- 40 Meter CW W9OWQ Mamie Hamilton, 1415 W Fourth St. Sedalia, Mo.

All score sheets must be received by the checking stations by or before MAY 30th.

PRIZES. The highest scorers in the phone and CW divisions will be selected, 1st, 2nd, and 3rd place prizes will be given to highest phone and CW stations, and in all cases, the phone stations will receive first choice between the two prizes offered:

- 1st prize: One TZ-40 Radio tube and pair of 866 radio tubes. (Phone station will choose one of these 2 prizes, the CW station will receive the other)
- 2nd prize One 1941 ARRL Handbook and one call-plate, to be used on transmitter or car. (same procedure as above)
- 3rd. prize One ARRL Antenna Book and one ARRL log book. ( same procedure as in first prize.)


Don't forget the Chicago Convention. Remember this is an ARRL National convention and the more of you girls go the more fun we will have. The more go the better entertainment will be planned for us.


NEWS FROM Here and THERE
