



But as you all know by this that nowhere is there any longer peace and not even the lowly amateur radio operator able to say he can be thankful that he is still on the air, well my little speach is all upset, so will leave it out. If you can't find your place in the scheme of things just yet, it seems to me one of the best things you can do right now while awaiting your further duties is to take the course in First Aid. The Red Cross gives it to groups of men and women wherever they can get a group together. Even if there were no war the course is very worth while as in peace times more people are hurt at home than any place else. You will learn what not to do as well as what to do.

9th. Dist. Chairman, Louise Baker, 912 Trendly, East St. Louis, Ill.


