



I'm a registered nurse, and a registered physical therapist. I work at Scripps Memorial Hospital in La Jolla, Calif. where I am in charge of the Physical Therapy Department.

At home, - well I am married to a City of San Diego Fireman (he drives the fire engine and loves it like an overgrown boy) who is WN6OCW. We have three boys, 9½, 4½, and 2 years old. I took to ham radio for relaxation and to keep from being driven insane by all the male element. I'm originally from Allentown, Pennsylvania and hope to pass my general class exam in time to take advantage of 10 meter band opening up to the East coast, so I can contact my folks.
