YLRL 16TH ANNIVERSARY PARTY RULES

Dates: Phone - From Wed. Dec. 7, 1200 EST to Thurs. Dec. 8, 2400 EST
 CW - From Wed. Dec. 14, 1200 EST, to Thurs. Dec. 15, 2400 EST
 Operate no more than 20 hours on phone and 20 hours on CW.

Frequencies: All bands. No cross-band operation.

Eligibility: Contest open to all licensed YL - YL operators thruout the world. Non-members of YLRL not eligible for awards. Contacts with CWs do not count.

Procedure: Call "CQ YLRL".

Exchange: QSO number; RS or RST report; name of State, U. S. Possession, VE District or Country.

Scoring: a - Add total number of contacts. Multiple contacts with same station, regardless of different bands used, will count as one contact.
 b - Multiply five (5) times total number of different contacts, regardless of location.
 c - All contestants running 150 watts or less input at all times, whether phone or CW, may multiply the result of item (b) by 1.25.

Awards: For YLRL members only (certificates will be awarded to non-members) - Highest phone score, Cup; Highest CW score, Cup. (These cups are awarded on a yearly basis. Any operator winning the same cup three times gains permanent possession of it.) Should any awards be donated, they shall be given to the 2nd and 3rd place winners, both phone and CW. Certificates for high score for phone and CW in each U. S. District, Possession, VE District and Country. All winners receive certificates.

Logs: Copies of phone and CW contestants logs must be postmarked not later than Dec. 31, 1955. Send directly to YLRL Vice President address on Page 2. Please list phone & CW contacts separately.

YL CENTURY CERTIFICATE RULES

1. Two-way communication must be established on authorized amateur bands with stations, mobile or fixed, operated by 100 different licensed women amateurs. Any and all amateur bands may be used.
2. All contacts must be made from the same location. Within a given community, one location may be defined as from places no two of which are more than 25 miles apart.
3. Contacts may be made over any period of years, provided only that all contacts are from the same location as defined in 2.
4. Contacts with YLs anywhere in the world are recognized, provided only that confirmations clearly indicate the stations contacted were operated by duly licensed women amateur radio operators.
5. 100 QSL cards, or other written communications from the stations worked confirming the necessary two-way contacts, accompanied by a list of claimed contacts, including the full name of the operator, alphabetically arranged, and the date and time of contact, must be submitted by the applicant directly to the YL-CC Custodian. Sufficient postage must be sent with the confirmations to finance their return by first class mail. The YLRL will not be responsible for any loss or damage to same.
6. Endorsements: Confirmations of contacts, accompanied by alphabetical list, as described above, from stations operated by additional YLs may be submitted for credit each time 50 additional confirmations are available. Endorsements will be made to the original certificate as application is approved. Gold stickers will be awarded to applicants who have worked their additional contacts from the same location (or within a 25 mile radius). Silver stickers will be awarded to those who have moved away from the location in which they earned their original certificate. (Of course no stickers can be recalled that have been awarded, but as of Oct. 19, 1955, this new system is in effect.)
7. Decisions of the YL-CC Custodian regarding interpretation of these rules as here stated or later amended, shall be final. All inquiries regarding cards, applications, or the certificate should be addressed to her. Address: Katherine M. Johnson, W4SGD, Box 666, Fuquay Springs, N. C.

"There are ten charter witches, the last one appointed March 7, 1955. They are: #1 - KZ5DG - Grace; #2 - TI2BX - Virginia; #3 - W3QPQ - Jeanette; #4 - W3VLI - Lolly; #5 - TI2PP - Cornelia; #6 - KZ5KA - Kay; #7 - W7OOY - Jeannette; #8 - W4HLF - Arlie; #9 - W2MEG - Willie; #10 - W6GAI - Fran. The following girls have applied for Associate Memberships in the Sister Hood of Witches: KZ5VR - Virginia; W3AMA - Peg; W2FZO - Ginger; W6MBI - Marie; W5OXT - Inez. Each girl who is appointed a Witch will receive a certificate. Also, there is a certificate available for working all the charter witches, called 'WACW'. This certificate is available only to those who already hold a Maritime Mobile Certificate and who worked each witch after March 7, 1955.

"Witch cards should be sent to W3VLI with sufficient postage to cover their return. We need more YLs on 15 meters — so hope this will be an incentive for them."

NORTH STAR YL CLUB (Minneapolis - St. Paul Area) had its first meeting in August; started with five YLs, now has twelve members.


