# JOBBS

From Mr. K. B. Warner, of A. R. R. L., I have received the following in regards to jobs in radio work for women.-----

" THE SIGNAL CORPS LABORATORY AT FORT MONMOUTH HAS JUST TELEPHONED ME THAT THEY NEED AT ONCE 250 WOMEN TO RECEIVE TRAINING AND EMPLOYMENT AS RADIO MECHANIC . THE PAY IS \$120 a MONTH WHILE RECEIVING INSTRUCTION FOR A PERIOD OF SIX MONTHS, WHEN THE WOMEN BECOME FULL FLEDGED RADIO "REPAIRMEN" AND MECHANICS AT \$135 a MONTH. THE WORK WILL BE RIGHT IN THE DEVELOPMENT LABS AT MONMOUTH, ASSISTING ENGINEERS IN RESEARCH AND DEVELOPMENT- VERY INTERESTING. THEY SAY THE BEST CANDIDATES ARE THOSE WITH SOME KNOWLEDGE OF RADIO, SUCH AS COMES FROM BEING THE SISTER OR WIFE OF AN AMATEUR. WHILE THEY DO NOT REQUIRE POSSESSION OF A LICENSE AND KNOWLEDGE OF THE CODE, OBVIOUSLY THOSE THINGS HELP.

They say that their need is very great, so that they want to deal direct with as many women applicants as possible. If you have any means of giving this publicity among your group, and could turn up some interested candidates, you would be making a real help to the situation. The training given is valuable and qualifies one for a good position.

Fort Monmouth is on the ocean and has some of the attractive qualities of a seashore resort. Unlike many such busy communities there is adequate housing, and the Signal Corps tell me they have attractive furnished quarters available at the modest rate of \$4.50 to \$5.00 per week.
