PROPOSED ADDITION TO THE BY-LAWS OF THE YLRL CONSTITUTION

BY-LAWS

SECTION 5. Proposals for amendments.

Proposals for amendments to the Constitution or By-Laws shall be submitted in writing to the Secretary, endorsed by five members. These shall be published in the next regular issue of the club paper. Votes on the proposal must reach the secretary within four weeks after publication, such date to be named in the publication of the proposal. Results of such votes shall be published in the next regular issue of the club paper, following the date of the ballot closes.

PROPOSED ADDITION TO THE BY-LAWS OF THE YLRL CONSTITUTION

SECTION 8. Individual compensation.

Individual acceptance of monetary payment by any officer of the YLRL as a result of her affiliation and association in the YLRL, whether it be for published material, personal appearance, or advertising testimonials, in which the YLRL is mentioned or referred to, shall be prohibited. Any such payment received by an individual is to be deposited with the Secretary-Treasurer of the YLRL, as a contribution to the YLRL treasury. Violation of this provision shall render the individual liable to permanent expulsion from YLRL.

PROPOSED ADDITION TO THE BY-LAWS OF THE YLRL CONSTITUTION

SECTION 9. Permanent treasury.

War bonds Q Series, 460722F Sept. 1943, 852 665F March 1945, 987 773F June 1945, 1 086 703F Dec. 1945, 1 087 639F June 1946, \$18.50 each donated by YLRL members not to be negotiable until maturity.

Minimum treasury balance shall be \$100.00.

Annual savings of not less than 20% of the dues for each annual period shall become permanent assets. Furthermore the balance between this 20% and the total treasury income shall not be expended for non-essentials, and any withdrawal from the treasury funds shall have the signed authority of the president. It shall be the additional purpose of the president to endeavor to expand our treasury through diligent attention to economies.

Attached to this issue also is a self-addressed postcard for your vote on the two above proposed additions to the by-laws of the YLRL Constitution. Please... vote yes or no and drop in the nearest mail box no later than May 1, 1948.

Your usual splendid cooperation ... in returning the ballot and postcard immediately will be greatly appreciated.
