The Foundation For Amateur Radio

RELEASE DATE: March 1, 1984

THE FOUNDATION FOR AMATEUR RADIO, INC., a non-profit organization with Headquarters in Washington, D.C. plans to award fifteen (15) scholarships for the academic year 1984-85. The Foundation composed of fifty local area amateur radio clubs, fully funds two of these scholarships from the proceeds of its annual Hamfest. It administers without cost to the donors, three scholarships for the Quarter Century Wireless Association, two for the Dade (FL) Radio Club and one each for the Radio Club of America, the Richard G. Chichester Memorial, the Young Ladies' Radio League, the Edmund B. Redington Memorial, the Amateur Radio News Service, the Columbia (MD) Amateur Radio Association, the Baltimore (MD) Amateur Radio Club and the Lewis G. Wilkinson Memorial.

Licensed Radio Amateurs may compete for one or more of these awards if they plan to pursue a full-time course of studies beyond high school and are enrolled or have been accepted for enrollment in an accredited university, college or technical school. Most of the scholarships require the applicant to hold at least an FCC General Class license or equivalent. The scholarship awards range from \$350 to \$900 with preference given in some cases to residents of specified geographical areas or the pursuit of certain study programs.

1984 YLRL SCHOLARSHIP

Applications for the 1984 YLRL Scholarship are now being accepted. Please pass the word to some good YL candidates.

The award this year will be \$500, thanks to the generosity of an anonymous OM who wanted to see us increase the amount of the scholarship. Applicants must hold an Amateur Radio license and intend to seek a baccalaureate degree in an accredited university, college or technical school in the United States. Preference will be given to (but is not limited to) academic study of communications and electronic or related arts and sciences.

The YLRL Scholarship is administered by the Washington, D.C. Foundation For Amateur Radio and is one of 15 scholarships being offered this year. Awards range from \$350 to \$900. Applicants for the YLRL scholarship will also be considered for any of the 15 scholarships for which they can qualify. Some

This is the 6th YLRL scholarship. The program was initiated in 1978 with a \$300 award going to Elizabeth Riener, N7IT in Seattle, Washington. Last year's YLRL scholarship went to Pamela Sue Hayward, WB0MUS of Kansas City, MO. Over the years, several YLs have also been selected for higher awards offered by the Foundation. One year there were 3 YL winners!

The YLRL scholarship is financed by the YLRL through special contributions and is administered by The Foundation For Amateur Radio without cost. No money is taken from the YLRL general funds. This is a very worthwhile effort and your support is solicited. Donations ranging from \$1.00 to \$100 built the fund to the point where it could support a \$300 award on a self-sustaining basis. This year we received the \$2500 contribution from our OM benefactor and can now guarantee a \$500 award from now on.

Please continue to support this program so we can continue to increase the award in future years or offer additional scholarships. Every dollar will help.

WBYL Worked Brazilian YLs

Applicants must work 8 Brazilian YL stations, totaling the name "BRASIL YL", which can be formed by the call letters of the suffix. Example: PY2JY, PY2ATL, PT2LS, PY4AKL, etc. Valid contacts only after January 1, 1983, all band, phone or CW. It is obligatory to contact one PY2 station. Contacts must have been made from the same QTH, in any band, or in any mode and in accordance with International regulations on Amateur Radio. Applicants must send a standard log, certified by a recognized Amateur Radio Association, mentioning stations worked, date, time, mode, report and band.



Catherine, W2RAQ had a great tour of India and Nepal and gave the YLs at the meeting a look of how others live.


Salli, W2UXM is not able to be on the air because no antennas are allowed where she lives. She is busy taking courses, reading, the theatre and playing bridge.
