Explanation

Those who read the YLRL article in May QST (Did anyone miss it?) will remember that the QST Editors made some comments on the use of the term "YL". For their benefit, as well as for yours, perhaps some explanation should be made. It has been the policy of the YLRL and of YL HARMONICS to use the term YL in a general sense, meaning any licensed amateur operator of the feminine sex. In QSOs many terms are heard, such as XYL, OG, OW, YF, and YL. If the general term of YL were used exclusively it would avoid a great deal of confusion. The fellows on the air are "OM" regardless of their age or marital status, and no-one seems to care. How many times have you QSOed a fellow who talked like a high-school boy, only to discover later that he has a daughter in college? There is an element of surprize in each new contact and that is one thing that keeps ham radio interesting. So use the term XYL only when speaking of the unlicensed wife of an amateur operator, and let the rest of us be YLs.

Election

- 160 phone: So far, the 160 meter phone net has not had much success. Those interested in making YL contacts on this band should get in touch with Marie, W8TPZ, and perhaps better times for skeds can be worked out.
- 75 phone: Net Control: W8KYR. No definite sked has been arranged yet and those interested should contact W8KYR with your suggestions.
- 80 cw: The 80 meter cw net has been functioning regularly every Thursday evening. Please note that because of daylight-saving time, this net now begins at 9:30 pm CST which is 11:30 pm EDT. Carrie, W9ILH, will be on the net frequency 3610 kcs, one-half hour before net time whenever possible. If you operate on 80 meters, get a crystal for 3610 kcs. and get into the net. Don't let the speed of some of the members scare you out, as the net always operates at the speed of the slowest member in it.
- 40 cw: Here are the new time skeds for the 40 meter cw net:
Tuesdays at 10:00 pm CST (Not daylight saving time)
Fridays at 11:30 pm CST (Not daylight saving time)
This net has been having trouble with high noise level in the afternoons, and we hope that the new evening sked will make more contacts possible. Many YLRL members operate in the 40 meter band, and if we all get on 7220 kc we will have a good chance to get acquainted. NCS: W9ZTU.
- 20 cw: Gladys, W8SJP, is looking for suggestions as to what time of day would be best for the 20 meter cw net. If you are interested, send her a card with your suggestions.
- 20 phone: The sked for this net remains the same, - Thursdays at 4:00 pm EST. The NCS, W2IXY, is on 14,244 kcs, and will tune the entire phone band for other members at net time.
- 10 phone: Net Control Station: W6QOG. Alternate: W1MCW.
Time: Tuesdays at 11:00 am PST. Frequency: 28,560 kcs.

Election of District Chairmen

The following Proposal for Amendment to the Constitution was received at the Secretary's office, duly signed by five members in good standing. Votes on this amendment must reach the secretary by June 30, 1940. Results of the ballot will appear in the July issue of YL HARMONICS.

Proposal for Amendment
In re: ARTICLE III Section 1. President
shall appoint District Chairmen annually.

District Chairmen shall be nominated and voted upon by the district members, whose first-hand knowledge of eligibility and qualifications of such members of the YLRL best fits them for this task.

The then acting District Chairman of each district to handle the election, returns being sent direct to the Secretary of the YLRL by the district members. The District Chairmen shall first check with the secretary to determine if all nominees are members in good standing and will have been in the club one year from date of time elected officer is to take office,--July first of each year.*

These elections shall take place during the month of June, immediately following the annual election of President and Vice President.

* Since the YLRL has not yet been in existence for a full year, this will not apply in the first election.

Worcester Convention

Following is the report of the YLRL Meeting at the New England Division Convention, Worcester, Mass., April 20th and 21st, 1940

It was decided to invite the YLs and XYLs of Hams to attend the meeting and there were nine licensed amateurs and about forty others present. In order to assure us of a good crowd we gave away an electric clock, and had all the girls fill out a card with information as to license and popularity.

The meeting opened with a talk by WLIOR who discussed YL contests, stations he had worked, etc., and extended his good wishes.

Lida, W1GQT, First District Chairman, gave a very interesting talk on the YL organization, how it started, nets, etc.

Our third speaker was Clinton DeSoto, who gave the girls all a word of encouragement, not only the membership of the YLRL but also regarding the social service club idea for the other girls.

As a result of the meeting the non-licensed girls in Worcester are forming a club with Mrs. Lyons, XYL of W1LBU behind the movement. The idea was received with considerable enthusiasm.

There was no question of doubt but that the entire meeting as well as the Beano Game and the talk by the Stylist on Sunday, which had been arranged by the Worcester Ladies' Committee, not only gave the girls a good time but the fellows a terrible bump of curiosity. Hi!

The committee arranged a place for me at the Speaker's Table at the banquet. I was in the very pleasant company of WLIOR on my left and none other than Percy Noble, our first district director, on my right. J.J. Lyons, W1LBU, Master of Ceremonies, and George Bailey, W1KH, Vice-Pres. of the League, was Toastmaster. Rules:

1. All YLRL members in good standing are eligible to make entries.
2. Drawings, with accompanying explanation, should be submitted in duplicate to the secretary.
3. Drawings of emblems should be of suitable size for use on QSL cards and letter-heads.
4. Make emblems as simple as possible, so that pins can be made up without too much expense.
5. Each member may submit as many entries as she cares to, but must submit duplicate copies of each entry.
6. Entries must reach the secretary's office by June 30, 1940.
7. In case of identical entries, the one received first will have precedence.
8. The member submitting the winning entry will receive a club pin made up from the chosen emblem.
