For the most part information you might be interested in and wudn't know unless you were, or are an officer.

"RADIO OPERATOR COMES TO AID OF CENSUS TAKER WID PROBLEM" printed from a report in the Idaho Sunday Journal, dated, April 24, 1960 contributed by W7GGV, Helen. "Ordinarily, a census enumerator conducts interviews in the strict privacy of the home, to keep the information confidential. Pocatello enumerator Dwaine H. Siesser, 345 Pearl, broke the rule last week--wid the authority of regional census supervisor Arthur Wilson. Siesser conducted a census interview via short wave radio and a ham operator. Siesser's district included Kinport Peak, he was told, and there was a family living on the peak that needed enumeration. The family lives on the peak year around; maintaining relay equipment for television. The only way to reach the top of the peak was walk--approximately 10 miles. No roads open this time of the year, Siesser said, and there are no telephones on Kinport. The dilemma was solved wid the aid of Helen Mailet (W7GGV) and her ham radio set. The Kinport operator communicated via ham set, so a link was established and the census interview was completed. Wilson said that to main-tain the confidence of the census interview, the man on the peak cud not be identified." This article will be sent on for the scrap-book, Helen, as requested. Wish others wud take time out to inform us of what they do, particularly the unusual.
