



The club dues have been set at twenty-five cents (25¢) a year. \*Provided that the member is a husband, wife, brother, sister, son, daughter, father, or mother of another member living at the same address, who is paying dues at the rate of \$2.50, she may, at her request, pay dues of fifty cents (50¢) per year, in advance, but without the right to receive QST; said membership to be concurrent with that of the member receiving QST. Will all members please notify the secretary if they are members of the ARRL, or if they intend to join, and if so, when.
