HOW IT HAPPENED TO _____
—SGT EVELYN KOTLARZ, WAF.—

I am from W9 land, Chicago to be more exact. I was sworn into the Air Force (WAF's) on January 3, 1950 and sent to Lackland Air Force Base Texas for basic training. During the eleven weeks I was there, I was given several aptitude tests. Not knowing my scores, I was given a choice of any of five Service Schools. As my first choice I requested Radio Operator's School and Radio Mechanics School as my second choice. My scores indicated an aptitude for radio, so I was fortunate enough to be sent to Radio Operator's School.

In April I started school at Keesler Air Force Base, Mississippi. The course was 32 weeks. I learned International Morse Code, Principles of Radio, and the operation of various radio sets. This was my first contact with radio of any sort. At the end of Principles of Radio, the instructor asked the class if anyone would be interested in taking an exam for a Class B ham ticket. Much to my regret, I did not take it.

Upon completion of school I was transferred to Langley AFB, Virginia. After two months of sitting around doing office work I asked for a transfer. I was placed in the MARS Radio Station (K4AIR). It was there I first became interested in ham radio. After becoming familiar with voice operation on the MARS frequencies, I was allowed to operate on certain night time schedules (I'm not sure, but I believe I was the first YL on the MARS freqs). Once I started working ham bands, there was no keeping me away from it. I loved every minute of it. In February I decided to try and become a ham. So I started studying. Finally, near the end of the month, I gathered my courage and went into Norfolk, Virginia and took the exam. I learned the very same day that I had passed, and

all I had to do was wait for my call to come through from Washington. In March I finally received my license, and I immediately applied for MARS membership.

(I also believe I was the first YL to become a MARS-AF member).

My first contact with my new call was on 20 meters. I had used voice on my MARS calls, so I was at ease with phone. However, I cannot say the same for my first CW contact.

In April I was transferred to Donaldson AFB, South Carolina, to open the base MARS station. The station opened up with a BC 610 transmitter and BC 342 receiver. At first the only operating I did was on the MARS frequencies. Later I did start operating on the 75 meter band when I was fortunate enough to find a Class A ham who would come to the shack. In June the station received a 32V2 and a 75A2, which most AF MARS stations receive.

In October, much to my regret, I was taken out of the MARS station and placed in the Base Radio Station. Mostly I spend my time on a CW net, however, once in awhile I do work voice.

As for personal operation, I haven't been able to. Wish I had more room. I do have a transmitter and a command receiver, and a BC 375 modified.

That just about covers it. However, I am looking forward to getting back on the air and making more contacts. I have only talked to two YL's. Those were W9ILH and W9LRT. I am looking forward to meeting some more of the girls. But being in the service limits the time which I can call my own. However I have hopes.

OMs call "CQ YL/OM".
Exchange QSO number and state, U.S. possession, VE district or country. Use Phone, CW or both. Skeds, crossband and CW to Phone permitted.

SCORING: 1 point for each station worked (YL to OM, or OM to YL only), multiplied by number of different states, U.S. possessions, VE districts or countries (except W/VE) worked. Any station, state, country etc. will count once only regardless of frequency band or mode of operation.

AWARDS: Highest OM score - Cup donated by W8UDA, now held by W1BFT. Highest YL score - Cup donated by W1BFT, now held by W6YYM. The cups are awarded on a yearly basis, with a three time winner obtaining permanent possession.

Certificates to 2nd and 3rd place winners.




