PRESIDENT'S

MESSAGE

Due to the fact that there has been a considerable amount of dissatisfaction and confusion in recent contests that the YLRL has sponsored, we have contacted the American Radio Relay League's Communications Manager, Ed Handy, W1BDI. We quote from his letter:

"When it comes to checking logs, our first point is to remove DUPLICATES, either as to stations worked or Sections, using as fine toothcomb as necessary, and making doubly certain that winners are top men. Yes, we do give the benefit-of-the-doubt when a log that is correct in all the many double checks (against Submitted logs) that can be made contains additional claims. Of course, we would not accept a log in which such claims constituted the whole log! We assume the accuracy of the reports included, where fellows worked have failed to submit logs.

It should be understood that we do not wish to criticize any other organizations methods of holding contests or checking as they find expedient. However, it would seem to us to be unnecessarily provocative of ill will to go about deleting points for non-confirmation when this latter is through no fault of the participant who did submit a log. The honesty factor, in our opinion, runs about 99% on such --- not to mention that many of the smaller confirmations do come through on postcards or QSLs to help those more ardently and actively participating in the tests!

So it is our policy to do as fair and honest and complete a check as practicable.... but not to go beyond submitted data, excepting where doubts cast in an initial complete check and in case of protest require our award committee to protect other participants by going the whole way with follow-up and investigation on submitted logs. It makes me very happy to say that the larger number of people participating in operating activities do so for the honest fun they get from the operating and swapping results with close friends and competitors---increasing operating skill and station efficiency usually in the process. You are quite welcome to pass the above facts along, but we would like the whole picture given considered, rather than a sentence at random utilized, since wrong impressions are sometimes given in that manner."

Now, I would like to state that during the forthcoming year in YLRL we will follow the above procedure in checking logs in the contest. We will give the benefit of any doubt to our contestants, as does the ARRL. When a contest is sponsored, therefore, let's get in there and plug for dear life.

YLRL QSO PARTY..... DECEMBER 9 - 10 & 16 - 17RULES

1. This contest is open to all licensed yl operators throughout the world.
2. Since this year for the first time we have a cup for the cw girls as well as for the phone girls, there will be one weekend for phone operating, and one for cw operation.

The phone contest will begin at 6.00 P.M. EST, December 9th and will end 12 Midnight, December 10th. Any or all phone bands may be used including cross-band phone operations.

The cw contest will begin 6.00 P.M. EST, December 16th, and will end 12 Midnight, December 17th. Any or all cw bands may be used including crossband cw operations.

Using this method will give those yls who work both phone and cw a chance to try for either or both Trophy Cups.

3. Correct procedure and exchange between yl stations worked:

"Call CQ YLRL" exchange:

Number, Station Call, Report, QTH, Time, and whether you are YLRL Member, or Licensed YL non-YLRL member.

4. Scoring:

- (a) Count 10 points each YLRL member worked
- (b) Count 5 points for each licensed YL non-YLRL member worked
- (c) Total number of points, and multiply by the number of states, possessions, or countries worked.
- (d) No points for working QM'S during the contest.
- (e) The same number of points may be counted for repeat contacts between yls on different bands.
