ELIGIBILITY: All licensed YL or KYL operators throughout the world. Non-members of YLRL may participate but are not eligible for awards. Contacts with CMs do not count, the YL/CM Contest will be held in February.

OPERATION: All bands may be used. Cross band operation not permitted.

PROCEDURE: Call "CQ YLRL" or "CQ YL".

EXCHANGE: QSO number; RS or RST report; name of section, state, U.S. possession, VE district, or country. Maryland and the District of Columbia count as one state. California is divided into eight (8) sections as follows: Santa Clara Valley, East Bay, San Francisco, Sacramento Valley, San Joaquin Valley, Los Angeles, San Diego, Santa Barbara.

SCORING: (a) Add total number of contacts. Multiple contacts with same station, regardless of number of bands used, will count as one contact.

(b) Multiply total of (a) by number of different sections, states, U.S. possessions, VE Districts or countries worked.

(c) All contestants running 150 watts or less input at all times may then multiply the result of item (b) by 1.25.

(d) Phone and C.W. contests will be handled as separate contests. Stations and multipliers will count only once in each contest; example: a station worked in the phone section of the contest may be worked in the c.w. portion of the contest for additional credit.

Cups will be awarded on a permanent basis instead of the progressive basis that was formally used.

**ANOTHER FIRST FOR YLRL:** A GAVEL WILL BE AWARDED TO THE HIGHEST YL CLUB ENTRY. THE AGGREGATE SCORES OF PHONE AND C.W. REPORTED BY THE CLUB SECRETARIES AND CONFIRMED BY THE RECEIPT OF CONTEST LOGS BY THE VICE - PRESIDENT SHALL CONSTITUTE A CLUB ENTRY. SEGREGATE CLUB ENTRIES INTO PHONE AND C.W. TOTALS. BOTH SINGLE AND MULTIPLE OPERATOR SCORES MAY BE COUNTED AS CLUB ENTRIES. ONLY THE BONA FIDE CLUB MEMBERS IN A LOCAL TERRITORY MAY BE INCLUDED IN CLUB ENTRIES.

Certificates will be awarded for high phone and c.w. winners. Highest score in each district, U.S. possession, VE district, and country, where at least three (3) entries are received, will receive certificates. Highest single operator c.w. score and phone score in any club entry will be awarded with a club certificate where at least three (3) single operator phone/c.w. scores are submitted. Only single operator stations are eligible for awards. Multiple operator scores will receive separate listings in the final results. The winner of the phone cup is not eligible for the c.w. award and the winner of the C.W. cup is not eligible for the phone award.

MESSAGE TO THE YLS ON TRINIDAD  
by Claire, W4TYI ex-VP4BC

This interesting account of Claire's experiences has been written in three parts. The following is the conclusion of Part 1.

Suitcases were hardly unpacked when the CM was down in Port of Spain searching out the Queen's Wharf Office of the collector of License Fees and the Marine Square offices of Government Wirelens in hopes of procuring a licence (British spelling) to operate on the Island. This courtesy was readily granted to him and he received the call, VP4BC, but with me it was a different story. I had to wait a month—who has two \$14.40's to spare in one pay check? Also there was the small matter of persuading the Colonial Government and a few others that a mere woman was capable of handling experimental wireless. Truthfully, the original arrangement was made only about a year before, designed to cover the needs of American men and Officers stationed on the U.S. Base and no provisions had been made to cover military personnel living off the Base or non-military personnel on or off the base. This latter category included me, also since our twelve year old Jr. Op. (General class for 2 yrs. already in the U.S.) was under the legal age of 21; he too was forbidden to operate. After some argument and a great many visits here and there, and one very plush ride to the Wireless office in the Consular car, I was permitted to pay them the fee to operate on the Base, and given the call, VP4BC.

Soon we were creating a great deal of neighborly interest. A native began climbing a giant coconut palm in the park behind us armed with a machete in the teeth (they just tie their feet together around the trunk and shimmy up) and a big loop of wire attached to his belt. Then a native,

accompanied by our son Mike took the other end of the coil of wire and climbed the cliff in front of the house and continued on up the mountain thru the jungle to a specified tall tree. And so the long wire went up. Of course, there was a complication — the tall tree was an AWT tree and the bloom's things objected in no uncertain terms! About midway in the proceedings a station bus struggled up the road that circled the house and ran over the wire at the back; then almost got hooked on the roof by the still low-slung antenna in front. The man in the coconut palm cut down a few coconuts while he was up there and the children had a big time drinking the milk from the green coconuts.
