PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

Greetings, again, to the members of YLRL:

On September 22nd, there were 841 of you! This issue carries important and interesting reading: (1.) The Secretary's report of your voting. (2.) A list of New and Re-Instated Members. (3.) List of States, giving present number of members



in each. (4.) A report on the YLRL Forum held at the ARRL National Convention. (Cards, notes or letters from any member discussing the problems discussed there, or any others, are always welcome.)

The November/December Issue will bring: Names of the 3 YLRL members who have endorsed the most new members this year, up to December 1st (thus winning the prizes of personalized jewelry, YLRL paper or pin, etc.) A printed page-section, to fill out and mail with your dues. With the change-over to the Re-written Constitution, this time ALL dues will be mailed to the 1959 Treasurer, who's name and address will be given on this printed page. And this one time, because of the change in fiscal year, your dues will cover a 14 month period, from January 1st, 1959, to March 1, 1960. This means that regular members will owe \$2.50 (not becuz of special assessment, but becuz the period covered is more than one year) and any new members who joined during 1958 and paid their dues thru 1959, will owe 50¢. This printed "coupon" is intended as a convenience for you, to help you send the information we need along with your check or money order. Dues are acceptable without it, if you lose track of it.

Another thing we hope the November, December issue will bring is a definite announcement of the Continuous Membership Certificates. It has seemed that some recognition shud be given to members who have belonged to YLRL continuously for a number of years. Plans are formulating for YLRL to award certificates for five, ten, fifteen, and (sooh) twenty years of continuous membership. Application wud be made to a Custodian, who wud consult the records of the Secretary and Treasurer. YLRL wud accept payment of back dues--some members wishing a certificate might hve a year or two lapsed membership to take care of, due to one of many reasons.

The January-February, 1959, Issue will have: Final financial report for 1958, Final 1958 Membership total, acknowledgment of 1958 gifts to YLRL.

YLRL's Congratulations go to Molly Henderson, ZELJE, and to Lucia Tone, CR7LU, who have qualified

for DX/YL Certificates No. 1 and 2. This new certificate has a drawing of the globe, topped with a tower and beam, and two YLs facing each other. MAUN is to be thanked for the design and cut.

YIRL sent birthday greetings and a note of appreciation to Dr. Lee DeForest, on his 85th birthday, August 26th.

Copies of the newly-adopted Constitution will be sent to YLs joining during the latter half of this year. All new members are sent mimeographed Membership lists, prepared and mailed by the Secretary.

Others who wish this list can buy one from the Secretary for 25¢.

One way of helping YIRL with a little Publicity is by members using the diamond shape insignia on their QSLs. Cuts for it can now be purchased from the Treasurer by a member or QSL printer for \$1.50. This is the same size cut as ARRLs.

While speaking of QSLs--a number of OMs, working toward YLCC, have been heard to comment favorable on the high percentage of returns to QSLs they mailed out following this year's YL/OM contest.

Cuts for the insignia and YIRL paper can be mailed promptly when ordered, as the supply is replaced locally. If, because of an unexpected large order, or run of orders, the supply of pins is used up, there is a necessary wait before the Treasurer can fill the orders. New supplies of pins are ordered from the East and the Co. only guarantees delivery 2 months after receiving the order. All members are entitled to wear the silver pin which sells for \$2.00, and all girls serving as D/C and other elected offices are entitled to wear the gold pin (past and present officers). They are available from the Treasurer for \$2.50.

The mail is sometimes slow getting YL Harmonics distributed, but if you are sure your copy has been lost, remember to write the Editor for another. Formerly, when YIRL hired a printing firm to publish its magazine, several unfortunate things could happen. The organization couldn't afford to order many more copies than it would use. An unexpected number of new members could make the original supply

short. Or there might be a number of mis-bound, incomplete copies, without enough extras to replace all. Or D/Cs might make a special effort to gather news, only to have the treasury dictate a small issue. Sometimes the number lost in the mail was greater than the number of extra copies. And these were situations in which your officers could do nothing! A second printing of an issue was out of the question, because of expense. Under present arrangements, extra copies cost us only the price of the paper used. 950 copies of this issue are being printed. A second printing is possible, should it be necessary, as the special stencils are saved. So we hope to have no members unhappy because of non-arriving magazines.

This year YIRL Harmonics is accepted at the Post Office for mailing to members in this country under the Bulk Mailing Rate, for ten cents per pound. This rate does not change until the end of 1958.

Comments on the Constitution Ballots were many. They varied from "congratulations", "FB", to definite rejection in sum sections. Hve tried to select remarks from a cross section of the districts to pass along. These Views as Reviews of our newly passed rewritten Constitution will be useful in future planning. Please read them carefully; your own or another's paralleling yours in sentiment will probably be included.

The parts of the Constitution, etc., most under "fire" were--Constitution, Article I - Section 2. By Laws, Article I - Section 1. Article II - Sections 5 and 6. Article III - Section 2. Article VI - Section 1. Procedure Policy - Section 16. On these sections, there were 5 or more rejections.

YLRL MEMBERS' COMMENTS: "The Committee has corrected a lot of weak points--change of fiscal year will make changeover much easier for new officers." "Fine to have committees, but how will they be appointed? I don't see provision for setting up the committees." "Lots of work to this--sure appreciate the thought and effort in behalf of YLRL." "The Constitution committee members shud be congratulated on such a nice job--also, like the new printing of Harmonics better."

"My thanks as sincere admirations to you YLs that hve wrked so hard this year." "Wud like to see published list of all committees, assistants, etc., as soon as new Officers have selected their helpers, FB job." "Much more specific abt rules,"

"Hve read constitution as by-laws vy carefully, accept all. Hpe the new membership drive is a success. Will be gld when Nets open agn." "Since technician class license is a permanent one, I feel that Sec. 1, under Art. 1, by-laws, shud read "All women who possess a valid amateur radio license of Technicians class or higher." "I am amazed at the amount of work officers as chairmen perform free. I'm sure all members shud give any aid asked gladly."

"Do wish there had been a few more candidates for some of the offices." "Think there shud be a limit of 25% or 50% to the assessment. Any more than tht shud be a vote of the membership." "A nominating chairman shud be appointed early in January. She needs all the time she can get." "One of the best rewritten constitutions I've seen. Certainly much easier to understand and read. Like it better in Harmonics as I can file it and keep on hand easier than shefts of paper."

(I've inserted some comments of appreciation for Committees, officers, and chairmen. That's our reward, gals, and to me, its very satisfying. Hi.)

"Procedure Policy, Section 16. How can you do this and still elect officers thru the members' votes. Procedure Policy, Sec. 15. Conflicts wid By-laws, Art. X, Sec. 2." (These say "general policy." Exceptions to them for the good of the organization, I'm sure, would be considered.)

"Procedure Policy, Sec. 1. VE is not a U.S. call sign area and why not KW6. KW6 cud be put with KH. Each member shud be able to have membership list annually." (New membership list is provided for in by-laws: available to new members free: slight extra cost to old members.)

"Do question Procedure Policy, Sec. 16. A good Editor hard to find!" (Editor not being an officer, probably this section wud not apply to her job.)

"In By-laws, Art. 2, Sec. 2. Seems as though Alaska shud be included in this. Art. XIII, Sec. 2, shud read "Fiscal year" insted of "Club Year."

"In contests why shud Calif. be in areas? Why not Texas or N.Y. or others? (These arrangements seem to be of long standing. Perhaps, some of the planning committee at that time, wud like to comment on this in future issue?)

"Do not feel adopted YL shud hve privilege of vote." "Also think we will lose interest and adoptees by raising the dues to \$2.00 plus postage." (The president's messages are very clarifying on the expenses of YLRL. Associate members covers rights and privileges of technician license.)

"I failed to vote in some sections becuz I didn't know what "Roberts' Rules of Order" was all about."

"I think Section 1, Article XIII, shud specify if there is a charge for club affiliation and the amount if there is such a charge." (No charge, and beginning this year, an affiliation certificate will be issued.)

"Opposed to non-secret ballots. Think envelope shud be signed insted of ballot paper."
 "Feel there shud be provision for the applicant minus endorsement becuz of some geographical areas where YL may be located some distance away from others. Article XI, Section 1. Quorum. Needs to be clarified." "Editor shud be considered an officer." "A changing constitution and by-laws is a sign of an active and growing organization."
 "Shud be an actual election--not one candidate. Suggest securing nominee at least from each YLRL club affiliate or each state club." "It shud be mentioned in Harmonics if old members will be carried thru to new fiscal year or pro-rate necessary for '59. I for one, won't complain if extra 50¢ asked for, Hi." (See president's mag. Dues to be \$2.50 to carry thru. Tax for your comment.) "Say, will all you gals need to wrk up WAS all over for that 49th State. Hi. Hi."
 "By-laws-Art. XI, Section 1. I fail to see how in a meetingless mtg, such as is a necessity in the case of the vast scope of the YLRL, a quorum can possibly be determined. A quorum must be a set number or percentage of a full membership and, in this case, such as the mailing of ballots to the entire YLRL membership wud be quorum is 100%. If a quorum must be specified as a part of the by-laws, let it be a set amt such as a standard percentage and thus be sure there is no loophole or vague statement. Frankly I see no need for the inclusion of it unless there are prospective group mtgs planned where there will be actual physical attendance."

Now--while I hve "mike", will say my 33 fer 58 as YLRL Secretary and tnx a million to u girls for your cooperation es responses. You may not be a million in number, but you certainly are equal to that in achievements, plus enthusiasm. The problems es pleasures of being a YL are truly only understood by another YL. C.W.: Start November 19, 1958 at 12 noon, EST
End November 20, 1958 at 12 noon, EST

Eligibility: All licensed YL and XYL operators throughout the world are invited to participate. YLRL members are eligible for the cup awards. Non members will receive a certificate for first place.

Only YLRL affiliated clubs will be eligible for the Club award. Contacts with OMs will not count. The YL/OM contest will be held in the spring of 1959.

Operation: All bands may be used. Cross-band operation is not permitted. Only one contact with each station will be counted in each contest.

Procedure: Call "CQ-YL"

Exchange: QSO number, RS or RST report, name of State, US Possession, VE District or Country.

California Stations will include the name of their section. California is divided into (8) sections as follows: Santa Clara Valley, East Bay, San Francisco, Sacramento Valley, San Joaquin Valley, Los Angeles, San Diego es Santa Barbara.

Scoring: A. Phone es CW sections will be scored as separate contest.

B. Multiply number of contacts by the number of different States, sections, US Possessions, VE Districts, and countries worked. (Maryland es the District of Columbia count as one state.)

C. Contestants running 150 watts input or less at all times may multiply the result of (B) by 1.25. (Low Power Multiplier).

THE YL FORUM

Many thanks to Beth Taylor, W7NJS; Betty Rogers, W0TYB; Jean Kincohlee, K6OQD; and Wanda Gluck, K6ENK for contributing material for the Forum.

Approximately 60 girls attended the YL Session or Forum on Saturday afternoon after that wonderful Ladies Luncheon or Fashion Show. The Luncheon was served around the corner from the Sheraton Park at the Fabulous Shoreham Hotel. The YLs returned to the Caribar Room at the Sheraton Park for their mtg.

After speeches which you read abt in Camille's article, "Convention Highlights" the open-Forum started. Discussion began with the subject of a Certificate Directory. A proposal had been made by the YLRL President and Editor to publish one which wud include rules for YLCC, YL/AP, YL/OM, es YL/DX. It was to include a list of girls who had already received certificates, some of the YL/OM combinations hving already recvd YLCC. It wud be the same size as Harmonics and use abt the same cover--colored if desired. The probable cost--25¢. One YL asserted it might be an expensive proposition. Another mentioned there wud be continuous additions of Certificate holders. Still another assured that the principal value was hving a copy of the Basic Rules at hand and that they wud probably not change. One YL wanted to know if the booklet wud be available to the OMs for 25¢. Another stated that the YL Directory had lost money and that this might happen to a Certificate Directory. The V. P. assured the girls that any slight change in rules wud be found in QST. One YL suggested combining the information with Harmonics. A Certificate Custodian mentioned the many letters of request she had received and answered abt rules at considerable personal cost. Another urged that custodians receive a number of copies to dispense to these girls, at which time she wud collect 25¢ for the booklet. Then there was much general approval and the consensus of opinion was to go ahead and print the Directory if the Treasury cud support it.

(This Directory may be ordered from K6HHD, Jan O'Brien, 3417 1/2 6th Ave., Sacramento, California for 25¢.)

The new Gestettner press for printing Harmonics was explained and the girls definitely preferred retention of the use of the Elite type in preference to the previously used smaller micro-elite type.

Next the YLs talked abt the kinds of News printed in HARMONICS. They all favored continuing with straight personal news but wanted more articles too. 

Having used the wrong call letters in introducing Liz, Mrs. Clark asked her to give her correct call es then sed, "I guess you hve said those letters often," to which Liz brot' out the fact that hams solve the language barrier by the use of Q signals. She said it no longer was unusual for women to become hams but when she first entered hamdom, it was a man's world.

Ethel, founder of YLRL stated that the present membership was over 800. 28.

Mrs. Clark remarked she had heard that some romances had developed as a result of ham radio and that it was a very good way to start a hobby. (Now, here is where Liz es Ethel slipped up. They shud hve cum bk wid, "You mean it's a very good way to start a hubby!")

Ethel explained the procedure to become a ham, es Liz went into the purpose of the organization, assistance in times of diaster, amateur radio filling the gap when communications go out, etc.

They brot' out that many conventioners came to the convention in family groups and the program included events of interest to the entire family.

Ethel explained the SWOOP organization, how the "suffering" wives of operators oud smash radio gear to their heart's content, and on that light note the interview was terminated. Deena Clark appropriately dedicated a song to hams, "Why Can't This Night Go On Forever?"



CORRECTION FOR CONSTITUTION


The Editor wishes to apologize for an error and an omission in the Re-written Constitution which she published in the May/June Issue of YL Harmonics.

Procedure Policy - Section 12: The Membership Committee shall have Membership Correspondents for each of the following areas:

- Eastern U.S. Membership Correspondent
 - Western U.S. Membership Correspondent
 - Canadian Membership Correspondent
 - International Membership Correspondent
- The Membership Chairman may serve as Membership Correspondent for the appropriate area.

Section 13: In filling vacancies for unexpired terms, an officer who has served more than 1/2 of a term shall be considered to have filled a full term of office. This provision applies to those officers appointed to fill unexpired terms as well as to elected officers.
