PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE



I would like to begin this final Presidential Message for 1975 by extending a special thanks to our intrepid Editor, Carrie, WA4BVD for the tremendous job she did on the Super Directory issue. I would also like to personally thank all of those who sent donations to aid with the expense of this most interesting document. Finally I would also like to thank all of you who have assisted me with the job of the Presidency over the past year. There have been a few controversies, but most of the year has been marked by progress and cooperation.

I had spoken before in my Presidential bulletin about the 16mm film on "Women in Amateur Radio" that is being done by the New York YLRL with the sponsorship of the Hudson Amateur Radio Council. I am anxious to hear from the membership as to what they think this 20 minute film should contain to best represent women in amateur radio. I had made a request for such remarks in my Presidential bulletin but none have been forthcoming, so I make this appeal in my last Presidential message.

I attended the Atlantic Canada Radio Convention and met many VE/YL's I spent a most pleasant three days in Moncton, New Brunswick. I was able to enroll five new members for YLRL and sell some directories. The Spar-ketts are a lovely group of ladies.

Next I spent four days in Reston, Virginia attending the MARCO and ARRL National Conventions. Here with the help of the Gaylarks we set up a YLRL booth and passed out enrollment blanks and sold more directories. We also had a productive forum discussing various YLRL problems. Several recommendations were made. 1. During contests the YL's should not all gang up on 14.275-14.310 but spread out over the band and also try 15,40, and 80 meters (I heard no one on 40 meters during Howdy days, the only band I had available).

2. A definite effort should be made to sponsor bi-annual conventions on the East and West Coast in the intervals between national conventions. 3. We need volunteers to make more "mini" conventions kits and banners for YLRL booths. The big kit is too much to mail. I'd like one for each district. 4. We should set a "Howdy Day" for the first Monday of each month on 14.350 at 1600-2000 GMT.

There were three hundred and forty-one (341) sealed ballots which were properly identified with the voter's name and call on the mailing envelope as required. There were twenty-three (23) ballots received with incomplete or no identification on the mailing envelope so that it was impossible to establish membership status. These ballots were discarded and not counted.

In several instances where no candidate was listed, a write-in vote was cast. However, none was counted or considered since the organization's by-laws in Article X, Section 3, state that "No member may be nominated to office without her written consent."

SHOWING PARTIALITY

I am a rehabilitation teacher which means that I travel about the countryside in Southwestern Pennsylvania, teaching adults who have lost their sight how they can still live happy, useful lives. Now I know that teachers are not supposed to have favorite students, but somehow I have gone astray. The recipient of my great esteem is a 73-year old man whom we will call Mr. W. He happens to be both deaf and blind, but teaching him has been easy since Mr. W. retains excellent speech since he did not become handicapped until middle life.

Mr. W. had an eighth grade education and spent his working career doing various laboring jobs. He never married, and his closest relative is a devoted sister. When Mr. W. began to lose his sight and hearing, he suffered much emotional stress which caused him to be placed in a hospital for indigent people where he has remained since 1957.

I met Mr. W. in 1962 when I began to help him in various ways—teaching him braille shorthand, typing, the one-hand manual alphabet used by the deaf, etc. I also enrolled Mr. W. in several correspondence courses in which he did excellent work. He began to participate in hospital recreational activities, craft classes, etc. Even though he cannot hear, Mr. W. still enjoys playing his mandolin. He is such a pleasant person that he has many friends on the hospital staff and among the volunteers. These people talk to him by printing on the back of his hand.

Two years ago, Mr. W. and I got the idea that Mr. W. could earn some pin money if he could get his certification from the Library of Congress as a braille proof-reader. At first, they did not want to accept his application since he was not a high school graduate, but finally they relented and gave him a chance. Now Mr. W. has completed the strenuous course and is about to receive his certificate. This is, indeed, a rare accomplishment only to be gained by hard work and patient endeavor. I, myself, would never tackle the job.

Each week my Seeing Eye dog, Cara, and I visit Mr. W. to help in any way we can. As I talk with Mr. W. using the manual alphabet, Cara watches our hands in complete fascination. Then, just before we leave, Mr. W. treats Cara to a couple of cookies. Yes, feeding a Seeing Eye dog is a "no no," but this is a special privilege that I grant my favorite student.
